Recent Audits/Reviews

The most recent audit of Community Services of Northeast Texas, Inc. revealed the following findings:

There were no audit findings. Areas reviewed include material weakness in financial reporting, material weakness in control over federal awards, significant deficiencies, audit findings required to be reported under 45 CFR Part 75 & 45 CFR Part 200, auditee qualified as a low-risk auditee, financial findings and questioned costs.

Head Start Program findings:

There were no areas of non-compliance. Areas reviewed include Comprehensive Education and Child Development Services, Health & Safety, Classroom Assessment Scoring System, Family and Community Engagement, Eligibility, Recruitment, Selection, Enrollment, Attendance (ERSEA), Fiscal Infrastructure, Leadership, Governance, and Management Systems.














